Keshia Cheesman

Director

Keshia Cheesman is a Caribbean-Canadian theatre creator, performer, and educator based in Mohkinstsis (Calgary, AB). She is passionate about experiencing, creating, and supporting art by diverse and marginalised communities, as well as uplifting children and youth through the power of theatre performance and creation. Keshia's play, Special, was featured in Obsidian Theatre (Toronto) and CBC Gem's 21 Black Futures, which won a 2022 Canadian Screen award for best web series. In 2023 The F Word – a play co-created and performed by Keshia and her art- partner Bianca Miranda, had its world premiere with Downstage, presented by Alberta Theatre Projects.

Death and The Poet

Death and grief are parts of life we can't escape, no matter how fast we run. In this theatre and movement show, we follow the Poet as they navigate encountering, accepting, and eventually befriending Death. Drawing from the playwright's Mexican cultural understanding of Death, this show is a love letter to living, grieving, and making art to make sense of the world.

Recently, Sofia has been awarded a PURE Award to conduct interdisciplinary research on Epistemic Injustice, and collaborated as a performer and co-creator in La Danza de los Viejitos, a dance/mask show presented at the SCPA's Alchemy Festival.

Javier Vilalta

Director

Javier is a Mexican-Canadian visual performance creator, stage director, movement coach, and translator. He co-founded the visual performance ensemble 8ROJO, along with Black artist Norma Lewis. With 8ROJO he has toured as far as Mexico, Czech Republic, Sweden, France, Taiwan, UK, and Iceland. With 8ROJO, he was awarded the 'Innovation in Performance' award at the 2016 STOFF Festival in Stockholm, Sweden; and he was a finalist for a 2021 Off West End Award in London, UK for Outstanding Production. He has translated the texts '100 Love Poems and a Song of Despair' by Pablo Neruda and Federico García Lorca's 'Rural Trilogy'. He translated and adapted the Mexican modern opera 'Anjou: A Tale of Horror' for Broadway Cares / Equity Fights AIDS.
